

WELLINGTON, MARLBOROUGH, NELSON, AND WESTLAND  
**ROOFERS, TILERS, AND FLOOR-LAYERS.—AMENDMENT OF  
 AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington, Marlborough, Nelson, and Westland Roofers, Tilers, and Floor-layers' award, dated the 18th day of April, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 513.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclauses (a), (b), (c), and (e) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) Roofers laying tiles, slates, or roofs of asbestos or bituminous materials, 3s. 7d. per hour.

“(b) Fixed-flooring workers—workers fixing tiles, linoleum, rubber, cork, or synthetic flooring-materials, 3s. 7d. per hour.

“(c) Bituminous and other labourers, 3s. 4¼d. per hour.”

“(e) An improver is a worker employed under the preceding subclause, and shall be paid not less than the following rates:—

(2) By deleting clause 17 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
