WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT CHEMICAL-MANURE AND ACID WORKERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District Chemical-manure and Acid Workers' award, dated the 30th day of September, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1272.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—
- (1) By deleting clause 9, and substituting therefor the following clause :—

- "Men required to enter sulphur-burners to clean same shall be paid time and a half rates while so employed, the minimum payment to be for two hours.
- "Men cleaning out acid-chambers or employed in repairing or demolishing acid-chambers, towers, or combustion chambers where it becomes necessary to handle material saturated with acid shall be paid 3d. per hour extra while so employed.
- "Men placed in charge of five or more other men shall be paid 2d. per hour extra while so employed.
- "Man in charge of mill department or man in charge of supermanufacturing department shall be paid 3d. per hour extra.
- "(b) A shift-worker employed on afternoon or night shift shall be paid 2s. per shift in addition to his ordinary rate of pay."

(2) By deleting clause 10, and substituting therefor the following clause:—
