

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT ELECTRICAL WORKERS
(RADIO SECTION).—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Northern Industrial District Electrical Workers' (Radio Section) award, dated the 30th day of April, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 347.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 26th day of October, 1945) shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clause 4, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“Wages

“4. (a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages:—

“Any worker, other than a factory-manager, placed in charge of three or more adult workers shall be paid 3d. per hour in addition to his ordinary wage while so employed.

“(b) Juniors may be employed at not less than the following weekly rates of wages:—

(2) By deleting clause 5 (General Orders under the Wages Emergency Regulations 1940).

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
