

NEW ZEALAND HOSPITAL BOARDS' ENGINE-DRIVERS, FIRE-  
MEN, AND GREASERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand Hospital Boards' Engine-drivers, Firemen, and Greasers' award, dated the 22nd day of August, 1945, and recorded in 45 Book of Awards 1153.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clause 3, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ *Wages*

“ 3. The following shall be the minimum rates of wages:—

“ (a) Where the work that an engine-driver is employed to do requires that he shall hold a first-class certificate as a stationary-engine driver and he is the holder of such certificate .. .. .	7 13 3
“ (b) Where the work that an engine-driver is employed to do requires that he shall hold a second-class certificate as a stationary-engine driver and he is the holder of such certificate .. .. .	7 8 0
“ (c) Where the work that a worker is employed to do does not require that he shall hold any certificate .. .. .	7 2 9”

(2) By deleting clause 4 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

(3) By deleting paragraph (i) of subclause (b) of clause 14 (Youths), and substituting therefor the following paragraph:—

“ (i) Eighteen and under nineteen years of age, £5 3s. 6d. per week.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
