HORLICK'S MALTED-MILK EMPLOYEES.-AMENDMENT OF AWARD
In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.-In the matter of the
Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942 ; and in the matter of the Horlick's Malted-milk Employees' award, dated the 25th day of June, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 641. In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15 th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows :-

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following :-
(1) By deleting clause 4, and substituting therefor the following clause :-

## " Wages

"4. The following shall be the minimum rates of wages :-
" (a) Adult males .. .. .. .. 6
" (b) Youths-

" Workers engaged on operating mash tuns, first stage evaporator and finishing pans, and the man engaged on the standardizing of milk shall be paid $£ 65$ s. 3 d. per week.

[^0]" (Note.-Attention is drawn to the provisions of the Minimum Wage Act, 1945.)
" (d) Adult females with no previous factory experience may be employed at a starting rate equal to the wage provided in the Minimum Wage Act, 1945, and after six months' experience shall be paid the adult female rate provided in subclause (c) hereof.
" (e) Workers employed for less than one week shall be deemed to be casuals and shall be paid not less than the following rates :-

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
