

WELLINGTON HARBOUR BOARD **LABOURERS (OTHER THAN
REGULAR HANDS)**.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington Harbour Board Labourers (other than Regular Hands) award, dated the 16th day of January, 1940, and recorded in 40 Book of Awards 1.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclauses (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f) of clause 3 (Rates of Pay), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) Ordinary labourers	3	3 $\frac{3}{4}$
“(b) Men working on pile-driving punt (except driver)	3	4 $\frac{3}{4}$
“(c) Men handling or spreading asphalt, tar, or bituminous mixture	3	4 $\frac{3}{4}$
“(d) Men using automatic borers, drills, and picks on rock or concrete	3	4 $\frac{3}{4}$
“(e) Men sealing the piles or the sheathing on the piles	3	4 $\frac{1}{4}$
“(f) Workers engaged feeding concrete- mixers or handling, mixing, or spreading wet concrete	3	5 $\frac{1}{4}$

(2) By inserting, after clause 3 (Rates of Pay), the following new clause:—

“Exclusion from Operation of General Orders

“3A. The rates of remuneration provided for in this award shall *not* be subject to the provisions of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
