

WELLINGTON PATENT SLIP CO., LTD., **FOREMEN ON SHIP-
WORK.**—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington Patent Slip Co., Ltd., Foremen on Ship-work industrial agreement, made on the 1st August, 1945, and recorded in 45 Book of Awards 1516.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said industrial agreement shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (c) of clause 1 (Salaries), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) The minimum salary on appointment as foreman shall be £40 per calendar month. Increments according to merit and service shall be granted during the first five years of employment as foreman so that the minimum salary after five years shall be £45 5s. per calendar month.”

“(c) For work performed on Saturday mornings an additional amount of 5s. 9d. per hour shall be paid, and for work performed on Saturday after 1 p.m. and on Sundays and holidays an additional amount of 8s. 6d. per hour shall be paid.”

(2) By deleting clause 4 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
