## (EXCEPT NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT GISBORNE JUDICIAL DISTRICT) RETAIL GROCERS' ASSISTANTS AND DRIVERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of

the Northern Industrial District (except Gisborne Judicial District) Retail Grocers' Assistants and Drivers' award, dated the 6th day

of November, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1601. In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic

Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power

in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:-
- (1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (b) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—
- "(a) The minimum weekly rates of wages for workers shall be as follows:—

- "(b) Branch manager or worker in charge of a shop or branch shop shall receive not less than £7 9s. 3d. per week."
  - (2) By deleting clause 5 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).
- (3) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 12 (Casuals), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—
- "(a) Temporary or casual workers may be employed from day to day, provided they are paid not less than the following wages for a minimum period of four hours in any day on which such workers are employed:—

  Per Hour.

"Under seventeen years of age .. . . . 1 6

- "From seventeen to twenty-one years of age ... 3 3
- "Twenty-one years of age and over ... 3 10"
- 2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
