

DUNEDIN CITY COUNCIL (WAIPORI FALLS TEN-MILE RADIUS)
LABOURERS.—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Dunedin City Council (Waipori Falls Ten-mile Radius) Labourers' industrial agreement, made on the 3rd day of September, 1945, and recorded in 45 Book of Awards 2214.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said industrial agreement shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clause 2, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ Rates of Wages

“ 2. The following shall be the minimum wages to be paid to the several classes of workers, as specified hereunder:—

“(c) Skilled timbermen engaged on timber-work—

“(d) Labourers employed on hammer and drill work and labourers spalling stone	3 4¼
“Labourers operating the undernoted power-driven tools: gads, rippers, rammers, and similar tools and certified men using explosives	3 5¼
“(e) Quarry faceman with ticket	3 5¾
“(f) All other workers in the employ of the parties cited in this agreement not otherwise specified herein	3 3¾
“(g) Men appointed as gangers or leading hands while so employed to be paid, in addition to their ordinary rate of wages, the following daily allowances—	
“Supervising two or more men	1 4
“Supervising six or more men	1 6
“Supervising twelve or more men	2 0
“(h) Men required to work in wet places and to whom gum boots are supplied by the employer under the provisions of clause 5 shall be paid for each day on which they are so working and wearing gum boots ninepence (9d.) in addition to the ordinary rate.	
“(i) Workers engaged feeding concrete-mixers or handling, mixing, or spreading wet concrete shall be paid	3 4¾”

(2) By deleting clause 3 (General Orders under Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940).

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
