## DUNEDIN CITY COUNCIL (WAIPORI FALLS TEN-MILE RADIUS) LABOURERS.—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Dunedin City Council (Waipori Falls Ten-mile Radius) Labourers' industrial agreement, made on the 3rd day of September. 1945, and recorded in 45 Book of Awards 2214.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:-

- 1. That the said industrial agreement shall be amended in the manner following:-
- (1) By deleting clause 2, and substituting therefor the following clause :--
