

WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT MALE HAIRDRESSERS' AND TOBACCONISTS' ASSISTANTS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District Male Hairdressers' and Tobacconists' Assistants' award, dated the 18th day of December, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1931.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clause 3, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ Wages

“ 3. (a) The minimum wage for journeymen or journeywomen employed on men's work shall be £7 per week. Managers or worker in charge of a saloon or shop, £8 12s. per week.

“(b) Casual workers shall be paid 3s. 9d. per hour, with a minimum of three hours' continuous employment.

“(c) Wages shall be paid not later than Wednesday of each week.”

(2) By deleting clause 9, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ Females

“ 9. Females employed in the shop as saleswomen shall be paid as follows:—

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
