

**OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND HAIRDRESSERS' AND TOBACCONISTS'
ASSISTANTS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Hairdressers' and Tobacconists' Assistants' award, dated the 12th day of July, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 684.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That this award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 6 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum wage to be paid to journeymen or journeywomen hairdressers shall be £6 17s. 10d. per week.”

(2) By deleting clause 14, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

(3) By deleting clause 22, and substituting therefor the following clause:—
