

NEW ZEALAND **MOTOR TRADE EMPLOYEES.**—AMENDMENT  
OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand Motor Trade Employees' award, dated the 17th day of December, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1960.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum rates of wages shall be as follows:—

(2) By deleting the figures and symbols “2s. 11d.” in clause 7 (Improvers), and substituting therefor the figures and symbols “3s. 5½d.”

(3) By deleting subclause (e) of clause 9 (Conditions relating to Garage Attendants and/or Kerrick Kleaner Operators), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(e) *Wages.*—The minimum rates of wages shall be as follows:—

“ Weekly worker substantially employed operating a Kerrick Kleaner: £7 1s. per week.

“ Hourly rate for Kerrick Kleaner workers: 3s. 7½d. per hour.

“ Garage attendants, weekly workers: £6 5s. 3d. per week.

“ Garage attendants, hourly workers: 3s. 2½d. per hour.

“ *Assistants.*—The minimum weekly wages for garage assistants shall be as follows :—

“ And thereafter, or on attaining the age of twenty-one years, not less than the appropriate adult rate according to the class of work he is called upon to perform.”

(4) By deleting clause 10, and substituting therefor the following clause :—

“ *Emergency Station Operators*

“ 10. Workers employed on emergency stations operating under the Motor-spirits Retail Hours Regulations 1946 shall be employed under a separate engagement as casual workers and shall be paid at the rate of 7s. 10d. per hour on award holidays, 5s. per hour on Sundays, and for all other hours worked at the rate of 3s. 11d. per hour, with a minimum of one hour in each case.”

(5) By deleting clause 11 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

(6) By deleting the figures and symbols “ £6 15s.” and “ £7 1s. 3d.” in subclause (b) of clause 27 (Exemption), and substituting therefor the figures and symbols “ £7 16s. 9d.” and “ £8 3s. 4d.” respectively.

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
