

NEW ZEALAND (EXCEPT NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT)
COUNTY COUNCILS' **MOTOR MECHANICS**.—AMENDMENT OF
INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand (except Northern Industrial District) County Councils' Motor Mechanics' industrial agreement, made on 16th November, 1939, and recorded in 39 Book of Awards 1783.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said industrial agreement (as amended by order of the Court dated the 13th day of September, 1945) shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clause 4, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ Wages

“ 4. The minimum rates of wages shall be as follows:—

	Per Hour.

“ ‘ A ’ Grade motor mechanics	3	9
“ Motor mechanics	3	7
“ Improvers	3	5¼

“ Welders: When a welder is not paid ‘ A ’ Grade mechanics’ rates, he shall be paid 1½d. per hour while welding in addition to the minimum rates herein provided.”

(2) By inserting, after clause 4 (Wages), the following new clause:—

“ Exclusion from Operation of General Orders

“ 4A. The rates of remuneration provided for in this agreement shall *not* be subject to the provisions of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
