

WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT (EXCEPT HAWKE'S BAY
PROVINCIAL DISTRICT) **LOCAL AUTHORITIES'**
LABOURERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District (except Hawke's Bay Provincial District) Local Authorities' Labourers' award, dated the 8th day of April, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 449.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. That this award shall be amended in the manner following :—

(1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (c) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclauses :—

“(a) For all labourers and other workers not specifically mentioned hereunder : 3s. 2½d. per hour or £6 7s. per week.”

“(c) The undermentioned workers shall be employed on a weekly basis and shall be paid the following rates of wages :—

(2) By deleting clause 20 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
