

NEW ZEALAND **AMBULANCE-DRIVERS.**—AMENDMENT OF
AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand Ambulance-drivers' award, dated the 11th day of August, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 1393.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (d) of clause 4 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) The minimum weekly wages for drivers covered by this award shall be £7 2s. 9d. per week for a forty-hour week.”

“(d) Employees who undertake driving duties during the ‘on call’ period as described in the preceding subclauses shall be paid 3s. 7d. per hour while engaged on actual ambulance duties.”

(2) By deleting clause 5 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
