

OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND **BREWERS, BOTTLERS, AND BOTTLE-
WASHERS.**—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Brewers, Bottlers, and Bottle-washers' award, dated the 7th day of August, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 1304.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this

Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 4 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages:—

(2) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 6 (Employment of Boys and Youths), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) Employers may employ youths at not less than the following rates of wages:—

“18 to 18½ years of age	3	12	6
“18½ to 19 years of age	3	17	6
“19 to 19½ years of age	4	2	6
“19½ to 20 years of age	4	10	0
“20 to 20½ years of age	4	17	6

“Thereafter, not less than adult rates.”

(3) By deleting clause 7 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
