

WELLINGTON CITY COUNCIL (MILK DEPARTMENT)  
EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD.

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Wellington Industrial District.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its amendments; and in the matter of an application by the Wellington City Council, a party to the Wellington City Council (Milk Department) Employees' award, dated the 16th day of December, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1940, for amendments to such award.

Wednesday, the 12th day of November, 1947

UPON reading the application by the Wellington City Council, a party to the above-mentioned award, to amend such award by deleting subclause (c) of clause 5, "Holidays," and substituting the following therefor:—

"Every worker shall be allowed a fortnight's holiday each ten months on full pay. A holiday of a proportionate duration shall be allowed to every worker who has worked not less than two months in the case of his leaving the employment."

And by deleting from clause 8, "Equipment," subclause (c), the following words in the second line thereof: "per annum."

And upon hearing Mr. W. J. Mountjoy, the agent on behalf of the Wellington City Council, and upon hearing Mr. G. Farrow, the agent on behalf of the Wellington Dairy Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, I, the undersigned Deputy Judge of the Court of Arbitration, acting in pursuance of an order of delegation of the Court of Arbitration, do hereby order by consent that the award be amended by deleting subclause (c) of clause 5 thereof, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

"Every worker shall be allowed a fortnight's holiday each ten months on full pay. A holiday of a proportionate duration shall be allowed to every worker who has worked not less than two months in the case of his leaving the employment."

And that the award be further amended by deleting from the second line of subclause (c) of clause 8, "Equipment," thereof the words "per annum."
