

NEW ZEALAND MOTOR AND HORSE DRIVERS.—  
AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand Motor and Horse Drivers' award, dated the 24th day of December, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 2209.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 3rd day of September, 1947) shall be further amended by deleting subclause (c) of clause 4 (Hours of Work), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, drivers engaged in the delivery of bread shall be paid 1s. 5½d. per hour for all time, other than the specified attendance to horses or motor-vehicles, worked before 7.15 a.m., such payment to be made in addition to the ordinary weekly wage. Youths so employed shall be paid 1s. 0½d. per hour in addition to the ordinary weekly wage.”

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
