CANTERBURY BOOT TRADE.—AMENDMENT OF APPRENTICE-SHIP ORDER

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Canterbury Industrial District.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1948; and in the matter of the Canterbury Boot Trade apprenticeship order, dated the 19th day of December, 1924, and recorded in 25 Book of Awards 1725. WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act, 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the Canterbury Boot Trades' Apprenticeship Committee for amendment of the Canterbury Boot Trade apprenticeship order, dated the 19th day of December, 1924, and recorded in 25 Book of Awards 1725: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended by deleting clause 6, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

"6. The proportion of apprentices employed under this order shall be two apprentices to each complete five adult workers in any department who have been employed not less than two-thirds full time during the six months immediately preceding the engagement of an apprentice.

"In any department where five or more workers are employed the proportion shall be two apprentices to each complete five workers and one for the number of workers up to four in excess of a multiple of five: Provided that a department employing less than five adult male workers may employ one apprentice under this clause."

2. That this order shall operate from the day of the date hereof.
