

OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND BREWERY, MALTHOUSE, AND
BOTTLING-HOUSE EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Brewery, Malthouse, and Bottling-house Employees' award, dated the 8th day of October, 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 1953.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 4 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages:—

“Coopers	8	1	4
“Headers-up and hoppers-down ..	7	12	2
“Maltsters	7	12	2
“All others	7	9	8”

(2) By deleting clause 5 (Casual Workers) and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“Casual Workers

“5. Workers employed for less than one week shall be paid at not less than 3s. 8d. per hour.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
