DUNEDIN LOCAL BODIES' LABOURERS-AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925; and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Dunedin Local Bodies' Labourers award, dated the 14th day of July, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 1190.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 5th day of September, 1947) shall be further amended in the manner following:---

(1) By deleting the symbols and figures "£6 10s. 6d." in subclause (a) of clause 2 (Rates of Wages) and substituting therefor the symbols and figures "£7 2s. 2d."

(2) By deleting the symbols and figures " $\pounds 7$ 6s. 3d." in subparagraph (s) of the schedule in clause 2 (a) (Rates of Wages) and substituting therefor the symbols and figures " $\pounds 7$ 17s. 11d."

(3) By deleting the symbols and figures "£7 11s. 6d." in subparagraph (y) of the schedule in clause 2 (a) (Rates of Wages) and substituting therefor the symbols and figures "£8 3s. 2d."

(4) By deleting the words and figures "Convenience Attendants:—Convenience attendants shall receive $\pounds 5$ 16s. 6d. per week for forty hours, and for Sunday work shall receive \Im s. 3d. per hour in addition to the ordinary weekly wage" of the schedule in clause 2 (a) (Rates of Wages) and substituting therefor the words and figures "Convenience Attendants:—Convenience attendants shall receive $\pounds 6$ 8s. 2d. per week for forty hours, and for Sunday work shall receive \Im s. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour in addition to the ordinary weekly wage."

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
