

NORTHERN, CANTERBURY, AND OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND
TANNERS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

[Filed in the Office of the Clerk of Awards, Wellington]

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Northern, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Tanners' award, dated the 8th day of December, 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 2264.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this

Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) Youths may be employed at the following minimum rates of pay:—
