DELEGATION OF POWERS TO NEW ZEALAND BOOT TRADES'
APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE

Pursuant to section 14 (1) of the Apprentices Act, 1948, the Court doth hereby delegate to the New Zealand Boot Trades' Apprenticeship Committee, registered on the 5th day of March, 1948, all the powers conferred on it by paragraphs (a), (f), (g), (h), (k), and (l) of subsection (4) of section 13 and by section 33 of the said Act, in so far as those powers relate to the industry in respect of which the Committee has been appointed—namely, the boot making and repairing industry—but reserving, nevertheless, power to the Court at any time to revoke or vary such delegation.
