

MARLBOROUGH BUTCHERS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942; and in the matter of the Marlborough Butchers' award, dated the 18th day of September, 1939, and recorded in 39 Book of Awards 1294.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 29th day of August, 1947), shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 2 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) Workers shall be paid not less than the wages specified in the following scale:—

(2) By deleting the figures and symbols “3s. 10d.” in clause 3 (Casual Labour), and substituting therefor the figures and symbols “4s. 1½d.”

(3) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 4 (Boys and Youths), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The employers may employ boys and youths at not less than the following rates:—

“ Thereafter as in clause 2.			

“ Provided, however, that a youth between nineteen and twenty-one years of age who has served not less than three years at the trade shall receive £5 0s. 6d. per week, and

provided, further, that a youth between the ages of seventeen and twenty-one years with no previous experience may be employed at a rate of 5s. less than the rates set out herein for the first six months of his employment."

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
