

**OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND WATCHMAKERS, JEWELLERS, AND
RELATED TRADES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Watchmakers, Jewellers, and Related Trades award, dated the 9th day of December, 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 2396.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting subclause (a) of clause 2 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum rate of pay for all journeymen working at any branch of the trade shall be £7 16s. 1d. per week. ‘Journeymen’ include jewellers, watchmakers, engravers, die-sinkers, diamond-setters, enamellers, and silversmiths.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
