## NEW ZEALAND (EXCEPT WESTLAND) FREEZING COMPANIES' CLERICAL EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand (except Westland) Freezing Companies' Clerical Employees' award, dated the 16th day of June, 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 1040.
