

**TARANAKI, WELLINGTON, MARLBOROUGH, AND NELSON
GROCCERS' SUNDRIES (GENERAL) EMPLOYEES—AMEND-
MENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Taranaki, Wellington, Marlborough, and Nelson Grocers' Sundries (General) Employees' award, dated the 18th day of August, 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 1377.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting clauses 4 and 5 and substituting therefor the following clauses:—
