OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND COACHWORKERS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Coachworkers' award, dated the 10th day of December, 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 2743.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting clause 3 and substituting therefor the following clause:—

" Wages

"3. The minimum rate of pay for journeymen woodworkers, painters, smiths, vice-men, panel-beaters, machinists, and trimmers shall be 3s. 11d. per hour.

"Assemblers shall be paid not less than 3s. 83d. per hour.

- "An 'assembler' is a worker engaged exclusively in assembling standardized parts of new vehicles and new implements, and shall use the following tools only to the extent required by such work: hammer, saw, paring chisel, gimlet, brace and bit, screw-driver, screw-driver bit, punch, file, cramp, and wrench."
- 2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
