

NORTH CANTERBURY HOSPITAL BOARD GARDENERS AND GARDENERS' LABOURERS—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the North Canterbury Hospital Board Gardeners and Gardeners' Labourers' industrial agreement, made on the 5th day of March, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 166.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said industrial agreement (as amended by order of the Court dated the 6th day of September, 1947) shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 4 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum rate of wages shall be as follows:—

(2) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 5 (Females and Youths) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) Females and youths shall be paid not less than the following rates of wages:—
