

**WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT METAL-WORKERS'
ASSISTANTS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District Metal-workers' Assistants' award, dated the 3rd day of October, 1938, and recorded in 38 Book of Awards 2913.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this

Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the order of the Court relating to Metters (N.Z.) Ltd., Petone, dated the 23rd day of March, 1939, and recorded in 39 Book of Awards 223, and as amended by order of the Court dated the 1st day of September, 1947, shall be further amended by deleting paragraphs (i) and (ii) of clause 1 thereof, and substituting therefor the following paragraphs:—

“(i) The minimum rates of wages per hour shall be—

“ Inside Duster	5	3
“ Roll duster	4	0
“ Wheel man	3	10½

“ To these wages shall be added bonuses as follows:—

“ Inside duster—

“ For alpha baths	0	6
“ For plain rolled baths	0	4

“ Roll Duster—

“ For alpha baths	0	3
“ For plain rolled baths	0	2

“ Wheel man—

“ For alpha baths	0	3
“ For plain rolled baths	0	2

“ These bonuses shall be paid on all first-quality baths produced on each shift so long as not less than 25 per cent. of first-quality baths are produced on each shift.

“(ii) Shot-blasters, while so engaged, shall be paid not less than 4s. 8½d. per hour.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
