In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1948.

DELEGATION OF POWERS TO NEW ZEALAND SADDLERY AND CANVAS-GOODS-MAKING APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE

Pursuant to section 14 (1) of the Apprentices Act, 1948, the Court doth hereby delegate to the New Zealand Saddlery and Canvas-goods-making Apprenticeship Committee, registered on the 31st day of May, 1948, all the powers conferred on it by paragraphs (a), (f), (g), (h), (k), and (l) of subsection (4) of section 13 and by section 33 of the said Act, in so far as those powers relate to the industries in respect of which the Committee has been appointed—namely, the saddlery and sail and tent making industries—but reserving, nevertheless, power to the Court at any time to revoke or vary such delegation.
