

AUCKLAND (TEN-MILE RADIUS) PRINTING TRADES FEMALE EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Auckland (Ten-Mile Radius) Printing Trades' Female Employees' award, dated the 25th day of September, 1945, and recorded in 45 Book of Awards 1458.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 6th day of September, 1947) shall be further amended by deleting subclause (a) of clause 2 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum weekly rates of wages shall be as follows:—

Age on Commencing Employment.	First Six Months.	Second Six Months.	Third Six Months.	Fourth Six Months.	Fifth Six Months.	Sixth Six Months.	Fourth Year.	Thereafter.
Under 17 years ..	33/6	40/-	47/-	53/6	60/6	66/6	73/6	90/9
Over 17 years ..	37/-	43/-	49/6	56/-	63/6	69/6	76/6	90/9
Over 18 years ..	40/-	47/-	53/6	60/6	66/6	73/6	80/-	90/9
Over 19 years ..	43/-	49/6	56/-	63/6	69/6	76/6	82/-	90/9

“Provided that a worker of the age of twenty-one years or upwards shall be paid not less than the basic wage for the time being prevailing.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
