

TARANAKI, WELLINGTON, MARLBOROUGH, CANTERBURY, AND
SOUTHLAND RACING, TROTTING, AND HUNT CLUBS'
ATTENDANTS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

[Filed in the Office of the Clerk of Awards, Wellington]

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Taranaki, Wellington, Marlborough, Canterbury, and Southland Racing, Trotting, and Hunt Clubs' Attendants' award, dated the 19th day of October, 1945, and recorded in 45 Book of Awards 1882.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court; for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by orders of the Court dated the 10th day of September, 1947, and the 1st day of March, 1948, respectively), shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clause 3 and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ Wages

“ 3. (a) The minimum rates of wages for workers employed at meetings on the Trentham or Riccarton Racecourse or on the Hutt Park or Addington Trotting Course shall be as follows:—

“ (b) At all other racing, trotting, or hunt club meetings the minimum wage shall be as follows:—

“ (i) Where a worker is employed for four hours or more—	Per Day.

“ Ticket-sellers	1 11 10
“ All other male workers	1 9 4
“ Female workers	1 6 6

“ (ii) Where a worker is employed for less than four hours, 3s. 7½d. an hour, with a minimum of three hours for any one period of employment.”

(2) By deleting clause 9 and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ Commencement of Engagement

“ 9. In the event of postponement, each worker directed by the employer to report for work and who does report on time shall be paid not less than 6s.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
