

WELLINGTON, MARLBOROUGH, NELSON, AND WESTLAND
**BRICK, TILE, POTTERY, ETC., WORKERS—AMENDMENT OF
 AWARD**

[Filed in the Office of the Clerk of Awards, Wellington]

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington, Marlborough, Nelson, and Westland Brick, Tile, Pottery, &c., Workers' award, dated the 23rd day of December, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 3386.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting sub-clauses (a), (b), (c), and (g) of clause 3 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages for the respective classes of workers:—
