

NEW ZEALAND (EXCEPT CANTERBURY AND WESTLAND)
STOREMEN AND PACKERS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

[Filed in the Office of the Clerk of Awards, Auckland]

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand (except Canterbury and Westland) Storemen and Packers' award, dated the 9th day of November, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1823.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 22nd day of August, 1947) shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclauses (a), (b), and (d) of clause 4 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) Storemen and/or packers over the age of twenty-one years shall be paid not less than £7 2s. 2d. per week.

“(b) In stores where one storeman and/or packer is employed who is solely responsible for all inward and outward goods, he or she shall be paid not less than £7 4s. 10d. per week.

“(d) Juniors may be employed at not less than the following rates:—

(2) By deleting clause 8 and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ *Casual Workers*

“ 8. Workers employed for less than one week shall be deemed to be casuals, and shall be paid not less than 3s. 8½d. per hour. When casual labour is employed, a minimum of four hours shall be paid for.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
