

**NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL AND
PASTORAL ASSOCIATIONS, RACECOURSE, AND SPORTS
BODIES' EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Northern Industrial District Agricultural and Pastoral Associations, Racecourse, and Sports Bodies' Employees' award, dated the 3rd day of October, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 1336.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement

made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949; doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 28th day of August, 1947) shall be further amended by deleting clauses 2, 6, and 8, and substituting therefor the following clauses:—

“ 6. The minimum rates of pay for the undermentioned classes of workers shall be as follows:—

“ Female attendants in lavatories	1	3	0

“ Any worker in charge of four or more other workers shall be paid an additional 2d. per hour.

“ Work done on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time, with a minimum of three hours.

“ Wages

“ 8. The minimum rate of pay shall be 3s. 7½d. per hour: Provided that the minimum payment on any one day shall be three hours' pay.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
