

DAIRY PRODUCTS, LTD., ENGINE-DRIVERS, FIREMEN, ETC.—
AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Dairy Products, Ltd., Engine-drivers, Firemen, &c. industrial agreement, made on the 28th day of November, 1947, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 375.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said industrial agreement shall be amended by deleting clause 10 and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ *Wages*

“ 10. (a) Workers who are required to hold a first class engine driver's certificate shall be paid not less than £7 14s. 5d. per week.

“(b) Workers who are required to hold a second class engine driver's certificate shall be paid not less than £7 5s. 6d. per week.

“(c) Workers employed as greasers, trimmers or as assistants who do require a certificate shall be paid not less than £6 19s. 8d. per week.

“(d) During the overhaul season workers shall be paid not less than £6 16s. 8d. per week, provided such work does not require the worker to have a certificate under the Inspection of Machinery Act.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
