## AUCKLAND (TWENTY-ONE-MILE RADIUS) BUTCHERS— AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942; and in the matter of the Auckland (Twenty-one-mile Radius) Butchers' award, dated the 14th day of June, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 586.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court, dated the 29th day of August, 1947), shall be further amended in the manner following:—
- (1) By deleting clause 5 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following clause:—
