

**WELLINGTON INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT MATCH-MANUFACTURING
EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF AWARD**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Wellington Industrial District Match-manufacturing Employees' award, dated the 11th day of February, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 16.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 28th day of August, 1947) shall be further amended by deleting subclauses (a) and (b) of clause 3 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) The minimum rates of wages of female workers shall be as follows:—

“ Provided that a female worker of the age of twenty-one years and upwards shall be paid not less than £3 13s. per week.

“ Provided that a male worker of the age of twenty-one years and upwards shall be paid not less than £5 15s. per week.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
