

**NEW ZEALAND RACECOURSE EMPLOYEES—AMENDMENT OF  
AWARD**

[Filed in the Office of the Clerk of Awards, Wellington]

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand Racecourse Employees' award, dated the 9th day of October, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1167 (in force in respect of Otago only).

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 9th day of September, 1947) shall be further amended by deleting subclauses (a), (c), (d), (e), and (l) of clause 2 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) The minimum rates of wages shall be:—

“ Male workers not otherwise specified  
in this award, 28s. 10d. per day or  
£6 18s. 8d. per week.”

“(c) Casual workers working on race-days shall receive a minimum payment of 14s. 5d. for any part of a day's work up to three hours: Provided that where the work extends beyond 1 p.m. such workers shall be paid not less than £1 8s. 10d.”

“(d) The wages for casuals employed by the day on race-days shall be a minimum of £1 8s. 10d. per day.”

“(e) Casuals may be employed on Sunday following a race-day held on a Saturday at not less than £1 8s. 10d. for a day's work or any part of a day's work.”

“(l) All racecourse workers employed in the capacity of caretakers and/or groundsmen, and/or male workers not otherwise specified, by all other clubs as defined by the rules of

riding or trotting and not included in subclause (b) hereof may undertake any work in or about a course without restriction as to duties, and shall be paid, if continuously employed for one week, a minimum of £6 18s. 8d. per week; or, if employed as casuals, a minimum of 3s. 7½d. per hour: Provided that workers employed under clause 3 (b) shall receive a payment of 5s. per week in addition to their ordinary weekly wage."

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
