NEW ZEALAND INSULATORS, LTD., EMPLOYEES— AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942; and in the matter of the New Zealand Insulators, Ltd., Employees' industrial agreement made on the 17th day of February, 1943, and recorded in 43 Book of Awards 272.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said industrial agreement (as amended by order of the Court dated the 22nd day of August, 1947) shall be further amended in the manner following:—
- (1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (c) of clause 3 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:
- "(a) Subject to subclause (c), the following shall be the minimum rates of wages for adult male workers:—
