

SOUTH CANTERBURY **CHAFFCUTTERS**—AMENDMENT OF  
AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the South Canterbury Chaffcutters' award, dated the 1st day of December, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 1453.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 5th day of March, 1948) shall be further amended by deleting subclauses (e) and (g) of clause 4 (Rates of Pay), and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(e) Where men are engaged under this award for a week or less they shall be paid a minimum of £1 1s. 11d. for each

day upon which work is done if and when the piece-rate earnings provided herein do not exceed the said minimum."

"(g) The minimum rate of pay for cooks shall be £5 9s. 8d. per week and they shall be supplied with food and accommodation."

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
