## NORTH CANTERBURY THRESHING-MILL AND CLOVER-HULLER EMPLOYEES-AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the North Canterbury Threshing-mill and Clover-huller Employees' award, dated the 1st day of December, 1942, and recorded in 42 Book of Awards 1431.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:---

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 3rd day of October, 1947) shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting the figures and symbols "4s.  $0\frac{1}{2}d$ ." in clause 4 (Feeder) and substituting therefor the figures and symbols "4s. 4d."

(2) By deleting subclauses (b) and (c) of clause 6 (Rates of Pay) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

"(b) The minimum rate for workers employed by the hour on standard or American mills or clover-hullers shall be 3s. 11d. per hour threshing-time."

"(c) The minimum rate for workers employed by the hour on header harvesters shall be as follows:— Per Hour. s.  $\tilde{a}$ .

"Driver (threshing or heading time) ... 3 114

"Other workers (threshing or heading

time)

... 3 10 "

(3) By deleting subclause (c) of clause 11 (Food and Accommodation) and substituting therefor the following subclause :—

"(c) The wages for a cook shall be £7 18s. 4d. per week where nine men exclusive of the cook are employed: £7 8s. 4d. per week where eight men exclusive of the cook are employed: £6 18s. 4d. per week where seven men exclusive of the cook are employed: £6 10s. 10d. per week where six men exclusive of the cook are employed: and £6 3s. 4d. per week where five men exclusive of the cook are employed. Seven days shall constitute a cook's week."
