## OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND PLASTERERS, FIBROUS-PLASTERERS, AND TILE-FIXERS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Plasterers, Fibrous-plasterers, and Tile-fixers' award, dated the 23rd day of August, 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 1388.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—
- (1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (b) of clause 5 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—
- "(a) Journeymen plasterers, journeymen fibrous-plasterers, and tile-layers shall be paid not less than 4s. 0½d. per hour."
- "(b) Fibrous plaster casters and wallboard-makers shall be paid not less than 3s. 81d. per hour."
- (2) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 6 (Boys and Youths) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—
- "(a) Boys or youths may be employed to assist at fibrousplaster casting and wallboard-making at the following rates of wages:—
