

CANTERBURY POTTERY-WORKERS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942; and in the matter of the Canterbury Pottery-workers' award, dated the 28th day of September, 1939, and recorded in 39 Book of Awards 1445.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations, 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 20th day of August, 1947) shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclauses (a) and (c) of clause 3 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages for adult male workers employed in or about pottery-works:—

“Thereafter, adult rates: Provided that a worker of the age of twenty-one years or upwards shall be paid not less than £5 15s. per week.”

(2) By deleting subclause (b) of clause 5 (Employment of Females) and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(b) *Wages*.—The minimum rates of wages for females shall be:—

“Provided that a worker of the age of twenty-one years or upwards shall be paid not less than £3 13s. per week.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
