

TARANAKI MALE HAIRDRESSERS AND TOBACCONISTS' ASSISTANTS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Taranaki Male Hairdressers and Tobacconists' Assistants' award, dated the 9th day of December, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 3073.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended by deleting clauses 3 and 10 and substituting therefor the following clauses:—

“Wages

“3. (a) The minimum wage for journeymen or journeywomen employed on men's work shall be £7 13s. 4d. per week. Managers or worker in charge of a saloon or shop, £9 5s. 4d. per week.

“(b) Casual workers shall be paid 4s. 1d. per hour, with a minimum of three hours' continuous employment:

“(c) Wages shall be paid not later than Wednesday of each week.”

“Females

“10. Females employed in the shop as saleswomen shall be paid as follows:—

"Any female entering as a shop-assistant under 16½ years of age shall be paid £1 13s. 6d. per week for the first six months, with an increase of 5s. per week for each six months until she enters the age scale provided in this clause,"

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
