

OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND HAIRDRESSERS' AND TOBACCONISTS'
ASSISTANTS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Otago and Southland Hairdressers' and Tobacconists' Assistants' award, dated the 14th day of December, 1948, and recorded in 48 Book of Awards 2539.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of April, 1949, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clause 5 and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ Wages

“ 5. The minimum wage to be paid to journeymen or journeywomen hairdressers shall be £7 11s. 2d. per week.”

(2) By deleting clause 12 and substituting therefor the following clause:—
