

DUNEDIN CITY CORPORATION AND DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE BOARD **ENGINEERS, ELECTRICAL WORKERS, AND MOTOR MECHANICS**—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Dunedin City Corporation and Drainage and Sewerage Board Engineers, Electrical Workers, and Motor Mechanics' industrial agreement, made on the 27th day of August, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1319.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by Regulation 39c of the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and upon application made in that behalf by the union of workers party to the Dunedin City Corporation and Drainage and Sewerage Board Engineers, Electrical Workers, and Motor Mechanics' industrial agreement, made on the 27th day of August, 1946, and recorded in 46 Book of Awards 1319; this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said industrial agreement (as varied by an industrial agreement made on the 14th day of April, 1948) shall be amended by deleting subclauses (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f) of clause 5 (Wages) and substituting therefor the following subclauses:—

“(a) The minimum rate of wages to be paid to workers covered by this agreement, excepting shift-men, and garage attendants, strikers, and machinists, shall be 4s. 2½d. per hour. ‘A’ Grade motor mechanics or a worker holding a third-class marine certificate shall be 2d. per hour extra.

“(b) The minimum rate of wages to be paid to shift-men at pumping-station shall be £8 10s. 8d. per week.

“(c) The minimum rate of wages to be paid to shift engineers shall be £8 15s. per week.

“(d) The minimum rate of wages for motor and garage attendants shall be £7 14s. 5d. per week.

“(e) The minimum rate of wages for strikers and machinists shall be 3s. 10½d. per hour.

“(f) The minimum rate of wages for gas-meter tester and painter shall be 3s. 9½d. per hour.”

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of June, 1949.
