In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Apprentices Act, 1948.

DELEGATION OF POWERS TO NEW ZEALAND JEWELLERY, WATCH-MAKING, ETC., APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE

PURSUANT to section 14 (1) of the Apprentices Act, 1948, the Court doth hereby delegate to the New Zealand Jewellery, Watchmaking, &c., Apprenticeship Committee, registered on the 3rd day of November, 1947, all the powers conferred on it by paragraphs (a), (f), (g), (h), (k)and (l) of subsection (4) of section 13 and by section 33 of the said Act, in so far as those powers relate to the industry in respect of which the Committee has been appointed—namely, the jewellery, watchmaking, engraving, and die-sinking industry—but reserving, nevertheless, power to the Court at any time to revoke or vary such delegation.
